CONTRACTS

Idaho Power Co. says it has signed an engineering, procurement and construction services agreement to build the Langley Gulch gas-fired power plant in Payette County. The plant would be built by Boise Power Partners Joint Venture, consisting of Kiewit Power Engineers Co. and TIC-The Industrial Co.

The contract price to be paid by Idaho Power is roughly half of the projected \$427 million project cost. The utility seeks state approval for the plant by Sept. 1, but its request has been challenged by industrial customers and others.
